Adding Environmental Design to Mine Development Phases

ABSTRACT

Environmental planning is common in all phases of mining development. Environmental planning applies standard industry practices to any given site. Planning and its implementation reduce environmental effects that may result from mine development activities. Environmental design is the next phase of planning as it addresses site-specific conditions, and often leads to innovation or improved ways to further mitigate environmental effects. In mining, there are opportunities to incorporate environmental design into site-specific exploration layout design, mine design (including closure considerations) and dewatering and diversion design engineering works. Examples of environmental design applications from across Western Canada using different mine phases, and mine developments will be shared. How consideration and incorporation of environmental design lead to project efficiencies and easier approval processes with regulators and local and Indigenous stakeholders will also be explored.
