1911 Gold Corporation: Reimagining the historic Rice Lake gold district

ABSTRACT

1911 Gold Corp. is a junior producer and explorer that owns as its flagship asset the fully-permitted True North mine and mill complex at Bissett, Manitoba, located approximately 150 km northeast of Winnipeg.

The Company also holds more than 54,000 hectares of mineral dispositions along a crustal-scale break known as the Wanipigow Fault – an ancient tectonic suture that defines the north margin of the Rice Lake greenstone belt. This belt is the western extension of the Uchi Subprovince of the Archean Superior Province, which includes the prolific Red Lake gold district, located approximately 100 km to the east along strike, and boasts more than 30 million ounces of past gold production. This highly favourable geological setting, coupled with the company’s consolidated land position in the historically fragmented Rice Lake gold district, present considerable strategic and exploration advantages.

1911 Gold is undertaking renewed exploration of its 100% owned properties with the goal of identifying additional sources of ore to augment the existing mineral resource of the True North deposit, estimated to contain approximately 1 million ounces of gold in all categories. The 2019–2020 exploration program includes an initial phase of up to 10,000 m of surface diamond drilling funded from the proceeds of a \$4 million non-brokered private placement financing. As well, the Company is continuing to operate the True North milling facility, producing approximately 5,500 ounces of gold annually from seasonal reprocessing of historical tailings.

With an experienced management team, clear corporate strategy, clean balance sheet, well-funded exploration program, strong project portfolio in an established operating jurisdiction, and systematic approach to exploration, the Company is well positioned to generate significant value through discovery.

BIOGRAPHY

Scott Anderson is the Vice President Exploration of 1911 Gold Corporation and has 30 years of experience in government geoscience, mineral exploration, academia and independent consulting, specializing in structural and mineral deposits geology. Prior to his appointment in 2018, Scott was the Chief Geologist of Precambrian Geoscience with the Manitoba Geological Survey. In his 17 years with the survey, Scott’s main research focused on the stratigraphic and structural settings of orogenic gold deposits in the Archean Rice Lake greenstone belt, including a definitive study of the Rice Lake (Bissett) mining camp, site of 1911 Gold’s True North mine and mill complex. Scott is a registered professional geoscientist with Engineers Geoscientists Manitoba and an Adjunct Professor in the Department of Geological Sciences, University of Manitoba. He holds geology degrees from the University of Manitoba (B.Sc. Hons) and Dalhousie University (Ph.D.).
